Babergh District Council is meeting twice in February. The January meeting scheduled as virtual and therefore with no voting rights was accelerated to an actual meeting on the 2 February as temporary restrictions had been lifted. Items covered Treasury Management, Housing Revenue Account Business Plans, Committee Timetables and Political Composition of Committees. The next Council meeting is scheduled for 21 February 2022.

# **Omicron Business Grants available to Hospitality and Leisure Businesses.**

We continue to support our local businesses. In response to the Omicron variant, Businesses in the hospitality, leisure, accommodation and personal care sectors can now apply for one of two COVID-19 grants. The Omicron Hospitality and Leisure Grant (OHLG) or the discretionary Additional Restrictions Grant.

Businesses must submit application before Friday 18<sup>th</sup> February 2022.

#### A warmer energy efficient future secured for residents on low incomes.

A successful bid for £7.4m on behalf of all Suffolk councils resulted in Babergh and Mid Suffolk receiving £1.9m designed to support local council tenants on low incomes. This will apply to approximately 80 homes within the two districts. Measures will include solar panels, air source heat pumps as well as a variety of insulation methods.

# Neighbourhoods to have a say in Planning

The Department of Levelling up, Housing and Communities have selected Babergh and Mid Suffolk Councils among 11 areas nationwide to be chosen as part of a pilot scheme to boost participation in neighbourhood planning. Unlike a parish plan or village design statement a successful Neighbourhood Plan has the statutory weight and once adopted is used to decide planning applications. Across both districts 50 parishes have embarked on the neighbourhood planning process and to date 16 neighbourhood plans have been successfully adopted. £45K has been awarded to create a new post to further encourage parishes and residents to engage with the planning process.



# **Babergh District Council and Climate Change**

The environment remains one of the key strategic focuses for our council and our residents. Our social media campaign went live this week with videos showcasing our fleets transition to Hydrotreated Vegetable Oil and our £2.8 worth of investment in solar at our leisure centres.

## **Rough Sleepers in our District**

I had the privilege of accompanying one of the BDC Rough Sleeper Navigators in Sudbury in January during the day. I visited all the contacts he and the team have developed to ensure that the community participates in supporting their clients, by offering available space for a tea and chat. Cafes, Coffee Shops, Charities, Church Groups and the Library/Community Access Point all offer their resources for this important group of people in our society.

## **Funding for Community Sports Groups**

Do you have a community sports group within your parish that could benefit from available funding?

Sports England's Queens Platinum Jubilee Activity Fund aims to use sport and physical activity as a means to bring a community together and tackle inequalities. Awards available are between £300 and £10,000 from a total pot of National Lottery funding of £5m. Access the Sports England website.
