Developing a "joined-up" strategy in our District

This week Babergh and Midsuffolk Cabinets approved work starting in the formulation of a parking strategy in both districts including everything from on-street and off-street parking through to the economic, environmental and community impacts to ensure that shoppers, tourists, visitors, residents, workers and commuters have access to sufficient good quality, safe and welcoming parking opportunities. The Parking Strategy due to be approved by September 2022 will look at our district over the next five to ten years. Recognising that in our three villages we have specific needs in relation to widespread indiscriminate parking especially on grass verges and near the shore. The fact that the public appear disinclined to pay for parking e.g Alton Water, presents us with the challenge of influencing motorist's behaviour and has been raised by me in various public meetings. There will be widespread consultation with Parish councils and a range of organisations.

Prompt reporting to the council or the police may prevent vulnerable and less able residents being seriously hurt or continuously affected by similar incidents.
