Babergh District Council Cabinet meeting 5 July 2022

Babergh Cabinet met and approved the Housing Revenue Account Business Plan for the next 30 years. Babergh already maintains 4,000 council properties for tenants however demand outstrips supply. At present there are 798 households on the waiting list. The business plan outlines how Babergh will invest more than £16 million in improving existing homes to ensure they are energy efficient – supporting the councils commitment to tackling climate change as well as building new homes to offer a range of good quality, affordable social housing for residents. The priorities over the next five years are:-

Tackling and adapting to climate change.

- Investing in council homes to improve their overall energy efficiency and reducing tenant's energy costs.
- Ensuring that each property has an energy efficiency rating of C by 2030 through a retrofit programme.
- Developing new council housing.
- Aiming to build/acquire 65 new homes in the district each year for the next six years.
- Investing in current homes.
- Improving the quality of current homes and communal areas.
- Involving tenants in the running of the housing service and putting tenants at the heart of decision making.
- Learning from every complaint and aiming to exceed the new Regulatory Framework and Standards.
- Improving neighbourhoods, the quality of estates and parking provision.
- Implementing digital transformation by helping residents to improve their digital skills and abilities.

Parishes contribute to help shape the councils parking strategy

On 27 June 2022 Holbrook Village Hall was the venue for Shotley Residents to contribute to the debate regarding the districts parking strategy for the next 20 years. Attendees were encouraged to raise their specific concerns in relation to their local areas. Councils urge joined up thinking over energy infrastructure in the east

Babergh and Mid Suffolk councils are calling for an urgent government review of the number and scale of the potentially devastating energy infrastructure projects locally. Their call follows both council's recent objections to the National Grid's non statutory consultation on proposals for the East Anglia Green Project of overhead lines between Norwich, Bramford and Tilbury. It would see additional pylons and cables installed cutting across both council areas.



Helping Local Communities tackle Climate change

A £150,000 fund has been opened to applications from not for profit organisations looking to develop and deliver community-based carbon reduction projects in Suffolk.

The Suffolk Climate Action Community Match fund is available to

Charities, community interest companies, parish councils, voluntary groups and other not for profit organisations. Projects must contribute to Suffolks Climate Emergency Plan.

e.g improving energy efficiency of buildings, promoting walking and cycling, using sustainable/recycled materials or raising awareness of climate change through events.
