

Anti-social behaviour awareness month.

Our community safety team have been out and about in our market towns in early July working alongside partners in tenancy management, environmental health and officers from Suffolk Police. They had successful days engaging with residents and listening to their concerns. ASB is very rare in our parishes, however it can very easily occur and unexpectedly. Ring BDC Customer Services direct or go online – Complete the questionnaire. This will be passed to the Safety Team if a general complaint or if the alleged perpetrator is a council tenant, then it will be referred to a Housing Officer for investigation. However, if the actions are illegal or violent then ring the police. (It is not illegal to smoke Cannabis in your own home) What is the most essential aspect is evidence, so diaries of events must be kept over a period of time. Not providing well documented evidence does not help your concern or help officers to action the problem. In some instances, the police/housing/community will carry out a "street a week" exercise engaging with residents to listen to their complaints before taking action if necessary. It would be helpful to keep me informed.

Summer Holidays
